- Aceh Selatan (Aceh South) district states – population: 25,000 (1930): Kluet (20, Suas Bakung), Tarumon (Trumon) (5, Tarumon) - pooled treasury of Aceh South;
- Bireuen district states - population: 102,000 (1930): Glumpang Duwa (12, Matang Glumpang Duwa), Peusangan (50, Geurugo), Samalanga (40, Samalanga) – pooled treasury of Bireuen;
- Calang district states - population: 20,000 (1930): Kluang (1, Lamboro), Kuala Daya (1, Gle Jong), Kuala Unga (1, Keude Kuala Unga), Lambeusoe (5, Meunasah Rayeu), Lageuen (1, Lageuen), Lhok Kruet (2, Meunasah Kulom), Pate (0.4, Pate), Rigaih (1, Rigaih), Krueng Sabe (1, Gampong Baro), Teunom (6, Teunom) – pooled treasury of Calang;
- Idi district states - population: 48,000 (1930): Bagok & Bugeng (1, Matang Seuleuma), Julio Rayeu (5, Julio Tunang), Julio Cut (1, Keudeh Julio Cut), Idi Rayeu (14, Idi), Idi Cut (5, Keudeh Idi Cut), Peudawa Rayeu (1, Kuta Peudawa Rayeu), Simpang Ulim (16, Keudeh Simpang Ulim), Tanjung Seumanto & Meureubok (1, Tanjung Toblang) – pooled treasury of Idi;
- Lammeulo district states - population: 26,000 (1930): Andeue & Lala (2, Andeue), Geumpang (2, Geumpang), Ilot (1, Ilot), Keumala (3, Keumala), Me Tareuem (1, Me Tareuem), Tangse (4, Tangse), Titeue II M. (3, Titeue), Cumbo V M. (8, Lam Meulo), Truseb II M. (2, Truseb) – belonged to pooled treasury of Pidie;
- Langsa district states - population: 40,000 (1930): Langsa (16, Langsa), Peureula (21, Peureula), Sungai Raya (2, Sungai Raya) – pooled treasury of Langsa, except Peureula having own treasury;
- Lhokseumawe district states - population: 69,000 (1930): Bayu (4, Keude Bayu), Blang Mangat (4, Punteuet), Blang Me (4, Matang Seuleuma), Bluek (1, Kuta Bluek), Geudong (5, Geudong), Lhokseumawe (5, Kutablang), Nisam (12, Krueng Geukueh), Samakurok (5, Keude Karieng), Sawang (12, Krueng Mane), Cunda (17, Kandang) – pooled treasury of Lhokseumawe;
- Lhoksukon district states - population: 71,000 (1930): Keureutoe (58, Lhoksukon), Krueng Pase (3, Teupinjo), Matang Kuli (4, Matang Kuli), Peutoe (6, Babah Geudubang) – pooled treasury of Lhoksukon;
- Meulaboh district states - population: 47,000 (1930): Beutong (3, Meunasah Panton), Bubon (6, Cot Seumeureueng), Kawai XVI Meulaboh (21, Meulaboh), Lhok Bubon (1, Lhok Bubon), Pameue (0.4, Pameue), Seunagan (0.4, Jeuram), Seuneuam (0.4, Pulokruet), Tungkob (2, Tanoh Mirah), Woyla (10, Kuala Bhee) – pooled treasury of Meulaboh;
- Meureudu district states - population: 28,000 (1930): Meureudu (16, Meureudu), Pante Raja (2, Pante Raja), Trieng Gading (10, Trieng Gading) - belonged to pooled treasury of Pidie;
- Serbeujadi, Gayo Luos and Alaslanden districts states - population: 47,000 (1930): Serbeujadi Aboq (4, Lokop), Gayo Luos (Petiambang) (23, Penampaan), Bambel Njohor (14, Batubulan), Pulau Nas (6, Pulau Nas) – the first two of the states had own treasuries, but the latter two had pooled treasury of Alaslanden;
- Sigli district states - population: 129,000 (1930): Aree II M. (3, Aree), Aron III M. (4, Aron), Bambi & Unoe III M. (6, Bambi), Gigieng III M. (4, Gigieng), Glumpang Payong III M. (7, Teupinraya), Iboih III M. (4, Gampong Blang), Ie Leubeue VI M. (11, Kutabaro), Keumangan IX M. (25, Beureunuen), Krueng Seumideuen (1, Krueng Seumideuen), Njong (15, Lueng Putu), Pidie XII M.-Kale & Laweueng V M. (25, Peukan Pidie), Pineung III M. (6, Lampoihsaka), Reubee V M. (7, Reubee), Sama Indra (11, Pulu Ie) – pooled treasury of Pidie;

- Simeulue Island district states – population: 20,000 (1930): Leukuen (1, Leukuen), Salang (1, Salang), Sigulei (3, Lammanek), Simeulue (4, Kampong Air), Teupah (11, Sinabang) – pooled treasury of Simeulue;
- Takingeun district states – population: 28,000 (1930): Bubasan (Ceq Bobasan Ketol) (11, Bubasan), Buket (14, Takingeun), Linggu (2, Linggu), Siah Utama (1, Nosar) – pooled treasury of Takingeun;
- Tamiang district states - population: 39,000 (1930): Zuidelijk Boven Tamiang (17, Benua Raja), Sungai Iyu (2, Sungai Iyu), Zuidelijk Beneden Tamiang (5, Seruway), Karang (15, Kampong Jawa Karang) – pooled treasury of Tamiang;
- Tapaktuan district states – population: 61,000 (1930): Blang Pidie (5, Kampong Kuta Tinggi), Kuala Batee (3, Lamoinong), Labuhan Haji (13, Kampong Baru), Lhok Pawoh Noord (5, Kampong Tangan Tangan), Lhok Pawoh Zuid (7, Lampong Sawang), Manggeng (6, Manggeng), Meukek (9, Kampong Kuta Gunung), Sama Dua (5, Kampong Tampang), Susoh (5, Kampong Pinang), Tapaktuan (3, Tapaktuan) – pooled treasury of Tapaktuan.

Notes:

- “II M.” and alike in names of states mean “Two Mukims (Townships)” and alike;
- districts (in the Dutch “onderafdeeling”) were entities, administered by the Dutch officer, titled Controleur.
